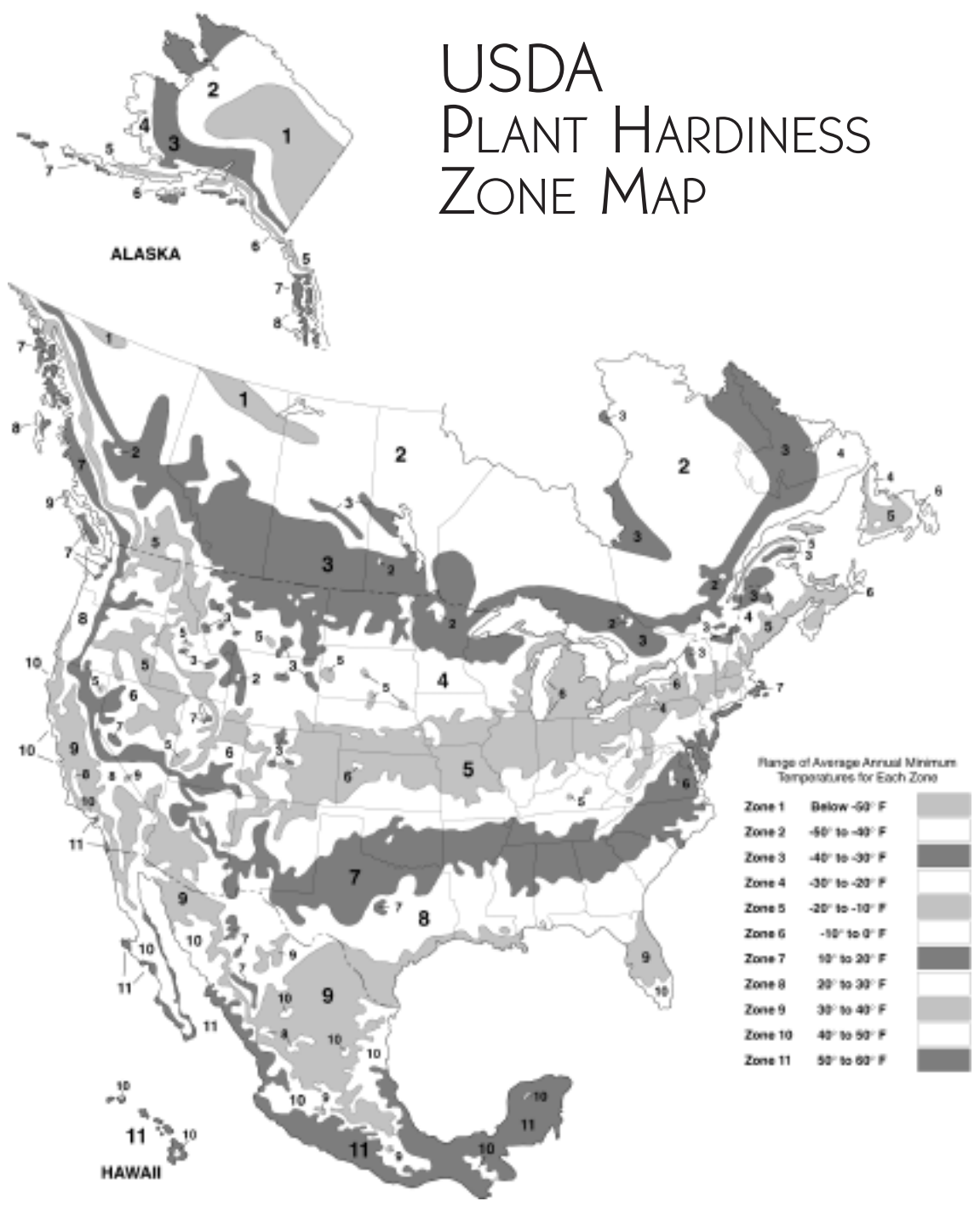


USDA PLANT HARDINESS ZONE MAP
